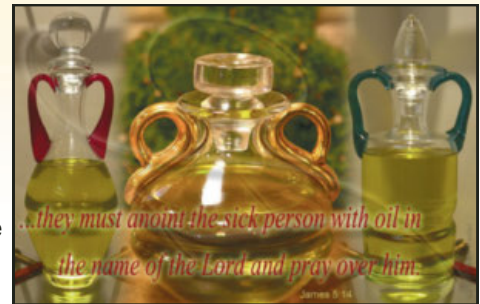
Children's Ministry

Everyone who desires to receive the Sacrament of the Sick is encouraged to participate. Family members and loved ones are welcomed and encouraged to attend the Mass which includes the anointing ceremony. **If you are uncertain** whether anointing is appropriate for you or your loved ones, please call 406.281.8505 and Kathy McCleary will assist you.



Who can be anointed? General instructions of the Church state that anointing is for "those whose health is seriously impaired by illness or old age." Included could be anyone with a serious illness, even if the illness is not life threatening; the elderly who are susceptible to illness; those about to have major surgery (recommend prior to surgery); and those afflicted with emotional and psychological illnesses such as depression, bi-polar disorder, addictions, etc.

Scripture Reflection: Resurrection of the Lord

Acts 10:34, 37-43
Ps. 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23
Colossians 3:1-4
John 20:1-9

"When Jesus had risen, early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had driven seven demons." (Mark 16:9)

Popular Catholic piety sometimes posits that the newly risen Jesus appears first to the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a happy thought, but it's simply not what the scriptures report. We are told quite directly that he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, **"out of whom he had driven seven demons."**

Why would the gospel writer remind us of this unsavory detail of Mary's past? Historians tell us women were not qualified to give legal testimony. On top of that, to be possessed by not just one, but seven demons, is unsavory and terrifying. What damage had they done to her? What did she do to allow herself to be home to such evil? It doesn't seem to matter. Jesus chose Mary Magdalene to be the first one who saw him risen from the dead. He decided she was qualified.

Do you think that you are disqualified from seeing and announcing the risen Jesus because of your past demons? Maybe they are the demons of despair, confusion, self-hatred, pride, addiction, failure, boredom, laziness, or other sins. Well, don't. In the light of the Risen Jesus, all these past demons make our witness that much more believable — only if we allow ourselves to be touched by the liberating hand of Christ, just as Mary Magdalene did.

The Diocese leads the Safe Environment program for all of our parishes, schools, and other programs/ministries to follow. The Safe Environment program provides education around abuse and neglect for our children, young people, and vulnerable adults.

The Safe Environment program is completed by all employees and volunteers who are working within the diocese and have any kind of contact with our children, young people, and vulnerable adults. The education helps to identify the signs for abuse and neglect, then helps to educate them on how to report the suspicions so that it may be investigated.



The Safe Environment program also has components that are used with our young people to help them be aware of safe boundaries and interactions with others (including their own age) and who to ask for help if they have a concern.
