#### Disciples of Jesus at St. Pius X BELIEVE

In a previous article, we wrote about **Why** being a dynamic disciple of Jesus Christ is the greatest aspiration on earth. There are many great answers as to why, not the least of which is this: **Being a dynamic disciple is** what Jesus wants for you and me, to experience abundant life and to be part of the Kingdom of love and mercy. Wow, what a powerful invitation to the fullness of life!

You may ask yourself, "what does a dynamic disciple look like," or "how can I become a dynamic disciple in my way?" Thankfully the Church has centuries of models of such disciples (Saints) and, in our time, has extensively researched what five qualities all dynamic disciples share. First of all, dynamic disciples of Jesus **BELIEVE** that Jesus is God and has come to save all people.

Belief may sound simple but genuine belief in God is a daily endeavor, constantly changing (dynamic!) and growing as we go through life. "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!" Mark 9:24. For a believer, it is not enough to accept that Jesus is a great teacher or that God is real but has little involvement in my life. Belief is not just a set of principles or rational arguments but a commitment at the depths of the heart to accept, love, and be in a personal relationship with God. Jesus himself told us this! Though He taught us many things about living a holy life, Jesus never claimed His teachings, patterns, and principles would save us. Only Jesus, personally, is the source of the fullness of life, for He said to us, "I AM the way, the truth, and the life" John 14:6. Not 'my ways,' or 'my teaching,' or even 'my church,' are the way... but only Jesus Himself, personally.

So what does it look like to BELIEVE in Jesus? The wisdom of the Church gives us many incredible insights: belief means being in a personal relationship with God, like Mary, who conversed with the angel and accepted God's way to save the world in Christ. Belief means living in friendship with Jesus so intentionally that all fears and struggles fall into place behind Christ, like St. Stephen the Martyr. He accepted death rather than deny his relationship with Jesus. Belief means spending time with Jesus each day in prayer and seeking him out in others. St. Teresa of Calcutta said it so well: "I see Jesus in every human being. I say to myself, this is hungry Jesus, I must feed him. This is sick Jesus. This one has leprosy or gangrene; I must wash him and tend to him. I serve because I love Jesus."

Belief means letting our faith pour through and color all of our life's experiences (not just at Church on the weekend) because it is who we are, with what, and with whom we are constantly concerned. No idea can affect our lives as powerfully as a relationship can, especially a relationship with Jesus!

To put it practically, disciples who BELIEVE in Jesus seek Him daily and have a personal relationship with Him that gives us abundant life. A great example in our community comes from our parish Knights of Columbus, who recently put on a BBQ at St. Vincent dePaul for our sisters and brothers experiencing hunger and homelessness. Our Knights stood out in the 100 degree-plus weather over a large, open-flame grill to provide substantial, delicious food for hours on a Saturday. It was not enough for these community members to stand by or keep God at arms-length: they had to act as Jesus would because they BELIEVE in Him in a personal way. Our parishioners' belief transformed their lives and subsequently blessed the lives of friends in our community who were hungry.

When was the last time you sat quietly and spoke directly with Jesus about what is going on in your own life? Have you ever envisioned Him right before you, ready to listen, encourage, and bring you healing? I encourage you to converse with Him each day with the same confidence you have when speaking to an old friend or beloved family member-Jesus wants you to know Him in an intimate and personal way because He is the way, the truth, and the life. By drawing close to Jesus, our hearts are changed, not because of persuasive ideas or teaching, but because we are in a relationship with him, a connection that animates and inspires us to strive each day to live as dynamic disciples. ~ Nick Coffman, Director of Liturgy, St. Pius X

### RCIA: A Journey of Conversion for Adults and Children

Are you or someone you know ready to have a deeper, intimate, more personal relationship with the Divine Presence—Our Lord Jesus Christ? Taking that first step inquiring and asking questions—can sometimes be the hardest leap of faith for a person interested in becoming a disciple of Jesus in our Roman Catholic tradition. We completely understand. Typical questions include: I have a child over the age of seven who has not been baptized; do you provide sacramental instruction? I am a middle-aged man who feels strongly that the Holy Spirit is calling me to enter the Catholic Church and to live a "new life in Christ." Is it possible for me to receive the sacraments of initiation at St. Pius X?

Please know that our parish community offers opportunities in small group settings to learn about the Catholic faith and in becoming fully initiated members through the church's sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and First Eucharist. Our sessions focus on the teachings of Jesus, Church doctrine and its sacred Liturgy, Scripture, and Tradition. Note also that our parish offers separate sessions for children and teenagers.

You are welcome to participate in this journey of learning, faith, and discipleship. Please contact, Matt Low, at the parish office and tell him how God is working in your life. Also, in the next month, our parish will host an *Inquiry Session* in the Church for those interested. Stay tuned for more details... In the meantime, may the Holy Spirit continue to bless you and your family with an abundance of love, joy, peace, and patience. Amen.

# **Scripture Reflection:**

Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

1 Kings 19:4-8 Psalm 34:2-9 Ephesians 4:30-5:2 John 6:41-51

The lens through which we view life makes a difference. It also determines who we choose to learn from and what we allow to shape our thoughts and feelings. For many, life is simply what it appears to be, a given that either through evolution or some other means just came to be. There is no apparent rhyme or reason to things and things can be dissected and understood only in terms of what they empirically present. To the person using this lens, a tree is a tree and a flower is a flower. Their composition and existence can be understood only to the extent that current human knowledge allows. Through this lens, what gives life purpose and meaning? This lens has an essentially unknown beginning and definite end. Once those are accepted, the middle becomes some kind of pursuit of happiness, with values and principles being things that are self-created and found acceptable.

But there is a Divine lens that also exists and deserves mention. It is found when one stumbles upon faith and begins to see things differently. This lens is of God and reveals a Divine Energy and Life that flows through and in all things. Faith then shows us that all that lives come from this one Source of Love. This is the only true lens that can give human beings the purpose and meaning they desperately need. From this perspective, all of life is much more than what is immediately apparent! It now tells and reveals a story about God's generous, creative, and unconditional love! The unfolding of the human story is the unfolding of God's story. What meaning our lives have when they are viewed as a part of God's love affair with humanity! We are indeed special.

The lens of our faith asks us to learn from Jesus Christ. Jesus, as the real Bread of Life, shows us our eternal destiny and completes and frames our lives. It is only in allowing ourselves to be taught by Jesus, that faith, hope, and love take on much greater importance. All the relationships in our lives are now structured and ordered using God's primary commandment of love. Jesus, then, is not just some man who lived at some point in history. Jesus is the incarnate Son of God who shows us the way, the truth, and the life. Using this lens changes things up a great deal. Looking at the creation that surrounds you and the special unique people you love, what is God trying to teach you about His love for you and the eternal life He wants you to have?


