

# Meet the Staff

#### Matt Low -Director of Christian Initiation

Time at St. Pius X? Two and half years.

Primary responsibilities? A big part of my responsibilities include overseeing the Order of Christian Initiation of



Adults (OCIA) and its adaptation for children—Christian Initiation for Children (CIC). I also coordinate our parish's infant baptism ministry. This essential parish ministry requires interaction with the infant's parents and their godparents for baptismal preparation and training. I work hand-in-hand with our pastor, deacon, and our liturgist to ensure that a rewarding celebration of baptism during the Mass takes place.

Our recent parish's *METANOIA* video series is an example of our parish's adult education. I lead the parish's efforts in this area to provide compelling spiritual programming that presumably leads to a loving, growing adult faith formation experience.

Another responsibility that I cannot forget is preparing couples for the sacrament of marriage. I facilitate wedding preparations and handle marriage annulments here at St. Pius X Church. Typically, for a wedding, I first sit down with the engaged couple and together we lay out a plan that will entail spiritual, religious, and liturgical considerations and guidance. Marriage preparation will include, of course, the necessary paperwork, couple-to-couple interfacing, and standard parish preparation classes. Assisted by our parish directors of music and liturgy—we together work with the engaged couple to arrange for that memorable wedding experience.

**Favorite part of your job?** Accompanying the lost, the faith seeker, and the believer into their deepening relationship with the Trinitarian God: Father—the Creator; Jesus—the Redeemer; and the Holy Spirit—the Flame of Fire.

**Hobbies?** Walking, hiking, traveling, reading books on spirituality, and both pro and college sports.

What is an unexpected blessing of working at St. Pius? There are the true blessings in working with a great team of fellow disciples, and the added bonus of attending 8:30am daily Mass!

What advice for the spiritual life have you received that made a difference in your life? It was a quote by the renowned 19<sup>th</sup> century American poet, Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, as told to me by a devout priest. I share these wise words with you as a recipe for healing and forgiveness: If we could read the secret history of our enemies, we should find in each man's life sorrow and suffering enough to disarm all hostility.

## **Grow Spiritually this Lenten Season**

The Wild Goose Ministry series, METANOIA, is always an excellent resource. Fr. Dave Pivonka, TOR continues as our host as we venture deeper into our Catholic faith and into our personal relationship with Jesus. The Adult Faith Formation team is offering these powerfully rich, spiritually stimulating video presentations leading us into Holy Week. Let's plan on meeting after the 8:30am Mass in our Fellowship Hall:

- On February 19, we kick-off with the episode titled, Jesus Calls & Empowers. Here Fr. Dave explores the love of God and how Jesus calls each of us into an intimate relationship with him.
- The March 12 episode titled This Teaching is Hard delves into Jesus' efforts to challenge us in our worldly thinking. We learn that as we go deeper in our conversion process we welcome God's actual grace to transform us, softening our hearts through his teachings.
- On March 19, we finish up the Lenten video presentations with the headliner, Do You Love Me? Fr. Dave touches here on the true essence of the Gospel message: God is love! Once you know and experience the love of Jesus you are never the same for you often want to share His love with everyone you meet.

METANOIA is a Greek word that describes a person's journey of religious conversion. In this continuous, change-of-heart process, a person desires a deeper, more discerning relationship with Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

## Be a Blessing to Others...

## **Scripture Reflection:**

Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Sirach 15:15-20 Ps. 119:1-2, 4-5, 17-18, 33-34 1 Corinthians 2:6-10, Matthew 5:17-37

It's often said that the Catholic Church lays heavy rules on her members, rules that can almost seem impossible. Mass every Sunday? No lying ever? Sexual purity all the time? I recently said to some non-Catholic friends that more than fifty adults were baptized at my parish at the Easter Vigil. One responded spontaneously with shock, "Why would anyone do that?" In other words, why would someone willingly place themselves in a system with such demanding and rigorous rules?

Of course, no one in the history of religions is more demanding and rigorous than Jesus himself. In the Sermon on the Mount, he says you have to be holier than Pharisees or you're out. He says if you call someone a fool, you go to fiery Gehenna. He says you can't even look at a woman with lust or you're guilty of adultery (which was punishable by death). To top it all off, he says you can't even get divorced and re-married. Doesn't he know these are basically impossible demands? What world is he living in?

The new one, actually. He is the new world. Jesus' words aren't meant to condemn. They are meant to signal something new, a restored humanity. Jesus doesn't just give external laws; he gives us his Holy Spirit to internalize the law through love. He wants to fill us with his love. That's what the Church exists to do. Love demands extraordinary things. The "demands" of the Church only make sense because she is filled with Jesus' love. That wildly demanding love is why we are Catholic. — Father John Muir ©LPi


