


# Youth Ministry

# Parish Nurse News: What Would You Do?

You're visiting your 70- year- old mother and she seems very confused and disoriented. She claims that the retirement home moved her to another apartment and she doesn't know why. You've heard about this behavior change from a caregiver's class that you took last month. You remember that when you notice a sudden change in behavior in an older adult, it should be investigated. It can be a sign of a urinary tract infection which if left untreated can lead to kidney failure and a life threatening infection in the blood.

Urinary tract infections are common in older persons. To not have to go to the bathroom as often because of mobility issues or fear of falling or because of stress incontinence, they limit their fluid intake. Limiting fluid intake gives bacteria a warm, dark place to grow in the bladder. As bacteria increase, they release toxins that affect the brain causing confusion. In addition, an infection can affect the rest of the body causing dizziness, frequent falling, fatigue, agitation, or a decreased appetite. Luckily for your mom, her primary health care provider ordered a urine analysis, found a urinary tract infection, prescribed antibiotics and she returned to her normal self.

If you suspect that a family member has a potential urinary tract infection, contact their primary health care provider, go to a walk-in clinic, or if after hours consider going to an emergency room.

# **Scripture Reflection:** Fifth Sunday of Lent

Ezekiel 37:12-14 Psalm 130:1-8 Romans 8:8-11 John 11:1-45

Of all Jesus' miracles, the most unsettling might be when he made a dead person alive. We know of three times when he did so: a girl, a young man, and Lazarus. The miracle teaches us he has the power of life and death. He anticipates his resurrection. Sin hurts us. Some sin kills us, spiritually. The three miracles reveal to us that no matter our circumstances, Jesus can give life to us.

The three miracles are instructive of the three ways we feel dead. The little dead girl symbolizes sin before it has time to mature. She's in bed and, once alive, gets right back to her life. The young man is lying in his casket in a funeral procession. This is sin allowed to fester, to grow and become somewhat normalized. Once raised, he has a short walk back home. Lazarus, a full-grown dead man, lies wrapped in burial bands in the tomb. Once he is raised, much needs to be done. He'll need to remove those bands, find new clothes, and travel all the way back home. That is sin allowed to go all the way, unchecked for months or years. It's the most spectacular of the three and reveals Jesus' glory more than the others.

What hope that should give us, for us and those whom we love! Jesus knows our sin hurts us and can even kill us spiritually. No matter the extent of the damage, he is always ready for the miracle of making the dead fully alive. ~ Father John Muir ©LPi

#### Ministry Spotlight: Foreign Priests

We have 50 churches and 50 missions in the Diocese of Great Falls-Billings, and we need a priest presence at each of these locations. While some of our priests have a dedicated parish, some of our priests cover a "cluster" of churches and may be responsible from anywhere from two to five parishes in surrounding towns.

While our goal will always be to have local men discern the vocation of priesthood, we know that we cannot currently depend on that to ensure that we have enough priests to serve our over 14,000+ Catholic households in Eastern Montana. This means we need support from priests who are from other countries and/or belong to specific orders versus being a diocesan priest. Without these priests - we would



not be able to celebrate Mass every week at each of our locations. Some of our parishes are already experiencing these scheduling issues.

Your support to the ACA assists the Diocese in helping our foreign priests with immigration services, support in transitioning to the United States and Montana, and other support as needed, so they are able to serve our communities.
