Meet Jess, Our Youth Minister!

Youth ministry accompanies the journey of our Junior High through High School students as they encounter and follow Jesus! That is our hope. That is our belief. And the disciple who welcomed this ministry as her own vocation and journey is Jess Sipes. It wasn't the path Jess thought she'd be on a few years ago. She had attended catholic schools in Billings until 3rd grade. Faith was always in her path, in her heart, but in 2013 her faithful grandmother Penny Sipes, a very active disciple here at St. Pius, with whom she often attended Mass, encouraged Jess to complete her sacra-



ments and be confirmed in the Church. Penny offered to be her sponsor and Jess entered the Rite of Christian Initiation process as a candidate. Little did she know the powerful journey that awaited her.

In addition to her learning more about the Catholic faith, her relationship with Jesus increased and that gave her a foundation that she needed when tragedy struck and her younger sister, Sam, a high school student in Great Falls, died. The RCIA community wrapped themselves around her. Karyn Haider, then the RCIA director here at Pius, went to Great Falls for the funeral. At our recent Parish Catalyst session, Jess shared with her group that this act of kindness and faith on the part of Karyn impacted her deeply and still does to this day. Jess, Penny and Karyn's friendship continued in the years since Jess' full initiation into the church. *Continued on lower left column, page 6.*

Scripture Reflection:FifthActs 14:21-27SundayPsalm 145:8-13of EasterRevelation 21:1-5John 13:31-33, 34-35

"It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the Kingdom of God." Many folks really work very hard to circumvent difficult situations. We prefer the easier way around something, rather than risk inconvenience, hurt or prolonged suffering. It's no wonder euthanasia is rapidly becoming acceptable around the world. Through purely human eyes, there is no issue bypassing the inevitable, taking control and bringing things more swiftly to a place of peace. If this is the way God sees things, then why does Jesus make such a big deal helping us understand the experience of suffering and embrace it? God's wisdom clearly takes us in another direction.

Imagine if we were able to eradicate ALL hardship and suffering. Where would we be? As we look at our own journeys, many of our solid more growth producing life lessons have been born of suffering, disappointment, inconvenience, darkness, and despair. There is something sacred about all of these experiences as God uses them to create something new. Envisioning a life without hardship and suffering brings us to a vision where everything is flat -lined and dull. As much as hardship and suffering are difficult crosses to bear, not taking them up runs the risk of us becoming shallow, empty, and lifeless. Helen Keller remarks that, "a happy life consists not in the absence but in the mastery of hardships." What an incredibly wise insight! Many really successful people and saints were brought to their station in life because they suffered. Suffering teaches us about what's important and propels us to search the depths of our souls for resources and strength we never would have known before.

This is especially true when we love as Jesus asks us to love. Love, perhaps above any other experience, can cause us great hardship, pain, and suffering especially when it's authentic and unconditional. While it can thrust us into an incredible experience of God and life on one hand, it can bruise and wound us deeply on the other. Mastering the art of love is the secret to living life well, walking in the presence of God and investing in the joy of the Gospel. Love and suffering walk hand in hand. Compromising one will compromise the other. Maybe that's why Jesus spent so much time convincing us to accept both. ©LPi

Karyn knew Jess had a deep love for youth since Jess raised her four younger siblings and remained involved with their and their peers' activities through the years. When the position of Youth Minister opened at St. Pius, Karyn urged Jess to apply.

In February of this year, Jess began her tenure as Youth Minister after spending a couple of months shadowing Amanda Michaels, who completed her Masters in Occupational Therapy through University of Mary and accepted a position at Wild Roots Therapy. Amanda accompanied her to Jess' first official youth ministry outing at "Get Air Billings" but in the fun of it all, Jess jumped on a trampoline to play "Tag" and in the process fell and severely injured her ankle. Jess said it's "a funny story now...at the time, not so much" as she shared her inauguration into her new position. We are happy to say that while there is residual healing left, the boot is gone and Jess didn't let this deter her enthusiasm for engaging with the youth of St. Pius! Jess has two primary goals for the youth of our parish: to help them encounter Jesus and to enjoy life while doing so. As Jess shared, "It's finding the balance: how to encourage them to have fun while also walking with them as they learn, share, and often struggle with the faith we share as Catholic Christians. I want them to be kids and to also be proud of this faith we share."
