## **Funeral Lunch Ministry Seeks Volunteers**

Summer is coming and the Funeral Lunch Ministry is looking for additional volunteers! This is an excellent ministry for those who:

- don't want to commit to a large-scale project
- prefer to be "behind the scenes"
- travel or spend extended periods away from Billings.

Simply put, you just volunteer to bring a food dish for a funeral if you are available when the request is made. This ministry thrives with many helpers to ensure that the needs of the funeral lunches will be met.

The disciples of St. Pius X provide this hospitality ministry so that our grieving brothers and sisters in Christ can GATHER in our community to encounter Jesus and feel the LOVE of our community for them. If you have questions, call Shannon in the parish office at 406.656.2522.

Volunteers are contacted through Flocknote communications (usually through email, but texts if you prefer) on a rotating basis when funeral lunches are requested by the family according to the expected luncheon size. To allow fairness and respect to all food volunteers, a food rotation has been set up. This spreads out the requests to different individuals, while allowing flexibility depending on needs.

When you receive the Flocknote, just choose what you want to bring and hit the "Sign me up" button when you're done. Reminders are sent when the signup closes.

If you haven't volunteered yet, use the QR code to sign up directly to be a food volunteer.

## Ascension of the Lord

**Question:** Couldn't Jesus have done more good if he stayed on earth, rather than ascended into heaven?



**Answer:** This is an interesting question! During his earthly life, Jesus gave sight to the blind, healed paralytics, drove out demons, and fed thousands with only a few loaves of bread. Imagine what he could have done if he'd never ascended into heaven! Imagine what our world could be! It's an interesting thought to consider, especially as the world faces challenges that only seem to deepen and expand. Yet at the Last Supper, Jesus says, "It is better for you if I go." Why? His response must have seemed strange to the Apostles at the time. In his place, Jesus says, he will send the Paraclete, the Comforter, the Advocate. He promises to send the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' departure allows the Apostles to become the leaders he has formed them to be. Jesus is no longer situated in only one geographical location, and his Church will never be a political kingdom. Soon after the Ascension, we celebrate Pentecost — the descent of the Holy Spirit and the radical empowerment of the followers of Jesus. We share in that empowerment and in that mission. Jesus is present in the sacraments, and he is present in us. Through our faith, hope, and love, we are called to be the good he does here on earth!



### Scripture Reflection: Ascension of the Lord

Acts 1:1-11 Psalm 47:2-3, 6-9 Ephesians 1:17-23 Matthew 28:16-20

Have you ever noticed how often we use "up" and "down" to judge things? Beethoven's Ninth Symphony is "high" art, while professional wrestling is "low." If I'm having a good day, I'm on "cloud nine." A bad day means I am "down in the dumps." A successful career is "moving up the ladder." Failure in work or personal life can be "falling from the heights." Life is filled with "ups and downs" — no one has the slightest problem understanding that means life has both "good and bad."

Now consider Jesus' ascension. He ascends not just to some level slightly higher of goodness, but "above all the heavens," to use the words of Saint Paul (Eph.4:10). That expression means to the source of all goodness. He has gone all the way down — to the farthest depths of human suffering, and death. And now he has taken our humanity all the way up into God. In doing so he has demonstrated what he says in the Gospel of John to the Father: "**Everything of yours is mine.**" He now reigns over every possible aspect of creation in and through his human nature. That's what the ascension is all about.

So what? No matter what the lows and highs, ups and down we face this week, we are totally encompassed by the one who descended and ascended. So, we should happily and confidently entrust ourselves to him. He has shown us not only his power, but especially his love, in filling all our ups and down with his presence. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi
