

World Mission Sunday

World Mission Sunday joins all Catholics of the world into one community of faith. At Mass, we recommit ourselves to our common vocation, through Baptism, to be missionaries, through *prayer, participation in the Eucharist, and by giving generously.*

Pope Francis asks us to respond to our baptismal call to mission by saying, "Here I am, send me." This is the mission that all Christians have received, and God gives us the grace to live it out wherever we may be.

In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism, as it offers each of us an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in more than 1,111 mission dioceses.



Here I am, send me to Africa...where those who are sick are provided loving care at 6,500 Catholic hospitals and small clinics, and where 19,000 young men are preparing to be priests, to uplift the poor, celebrate the Sacraments, reach out to children and families, and comfort the sick and dying.

Here I am, send me to Asia...where six million children receive an education from Religious sisters in more than 15,000 Church-run elementary schools.

Here I am, send me to Latin America...where catechists travel to remote areas to bring the Good News of God's great love to families.

Here I am, send me to the Pacific Islands...where 3,500 religious bring the Lord's mercy and peace to those in need.

Here I am, send me to Europe...where new churches are being built to welcome faith communities, renewed after years of persecution.

As we pray and respond on World Mission Sunday here at home, we share in those celebrations taking place in every parish and school throughout the world. Together, through our prayers and financial support, we bring the Lord's mercy and concrete help to the most vulnerable communities in the Pope's missions.

Trick-or-Treat for Diapers!

Diapers! Especially sizes 4, 5 & 6 are needed to sweeten Family Promise's Community Diaper Bank! Family Promise of Yellowstone Valley has the only Diaper Bank in our community. Diapers are a basic need as well as food and shelter.

All diapers distributed through the mobile diaper bank are free to low income families and allow parents to continue employment by supplying diapers for childcare and to ease the stress that arises from a tight budget; diapers or important bills?

So far, the FPYV Community Diaper Bank has distributed over 80,000 diapers in 2020, a large increase from 2019. This program utilizes community donations to fill the van which offers curbside diaper bank hours in various locations in and around Billings.

Why are there Liturgical Cycles?



Answer: While most Catholics know that the Church Year is divided into various seasons (e.g.

Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, etc.), many are unaware that the one Church Year is not like the one that follows. While the main seasons and feasts are the same from year to year, the 3-year cycle for Sundays and the 2-year cycle for weekdays means that, as a general rule, the readings in the *Lectionary* that we hear at Mass will change from year to year, helping us to have a richer encounter with Sacred Scripture. Each new cycle begins with the beginning of the liturgical year, the First Sunday of Advent.

The reasoning behind this innovation is outlined in *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, the "Dogmatic Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy" of the Second Vatican Council: "The treasures of the bible are to be opened up more lavishly, so that richer fare may be provided for the faithful at the table of God's word. In this way a more representative portion of the holy scriptures will be read to the people in the course of a prescribed number of years" (no. 51). This was fully achieved in 1969 when the new cycles of readings were approved by Pope Saint Paul VI.

Scripture Reflection:

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah 45:1 4-6
Psalm 96:1, 3-5, 7-10
1 Thessalonians 1:1-5
Matthew 22:15-21

Nobody enjoys paying taxes. Despite our displeasure in being forced to do so, we also realize that the monies generated from taxes allows governments to provide essential services for its people. Corruption really gets our goat, however. When we witness malfeasance, overspending, irresponsibility, and dishonesty in governmental spending, the grave injustices make an already unpleasant and arduous task even more difficult. The inappropriate distribution and use of hard-earned monies can leave a person quite angry and disconnected. It's bad enough the government wants something from me, now God does, too?

God is not concerned necessarily with our money, although its proper use does factor into our faith life. As the payment of secular taxes speaks of our allegiance to the government, our return to God speaks of our allegiance to God. All of creation, even the entire universe, is fashioned in the image and likeness of God. What speaks to God and has meaning and relevance to him? All of creation and indeed our very selves! God delights in us and when we present ourselves back to him, he delights even more! As the payment of secular taxes is designed to secure the equitable distribution of goods and services to all people, so is our return of ourselves to God in gratitude meant to advance God's kingdom here on earth.

When our exclusive and sincere allegiance is given to God, God can use us to set things right and straight again. The wounds of sin distort our relationship and disorder our world. By giving ourselves and all of creation back to God in gratitude, we acknowledge the proper Creator and Author of life for who He is and devote our labors exclusively to God's kingdom and the justice, peace, or order God envisions. In giving back to God all that belongs to God, we set the axis of our lives correctly and put our priorities in proper order. All of our relationships, especially with God, our brothers and sisters, and all of creation are perceived more clearly as they really are. Using, accumulating, wasting, exploiting, hoarding, and self-preservation are no longer necessary.
